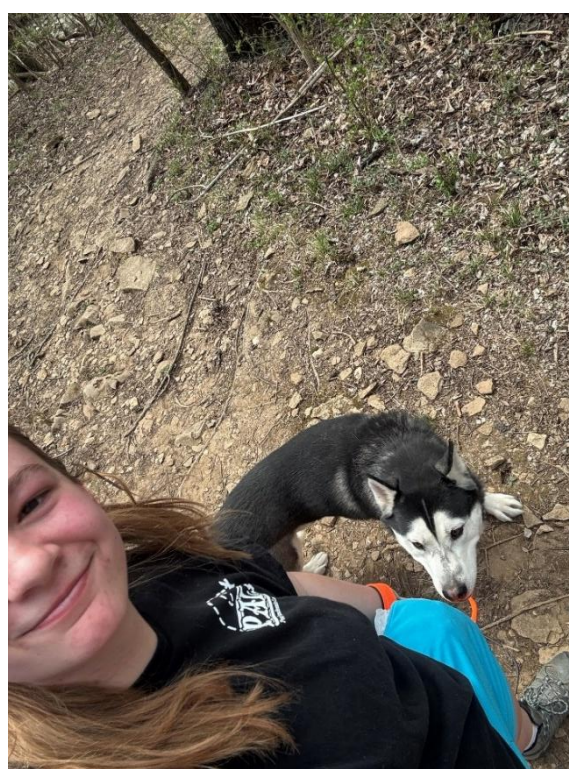

Volunteer at Heart to Heart - International

Park University Rotaract student club participated in a community event, packing personal hygiene kits, at *Heart to Heart International (HHI, www.hearttoheart.org)*, Lenexa, KS on 10/28/2025 evening. With a total around 75 volunteers from the community, 2,400 hygiene kits were packed that evening. HHI is a nonprofit focused on improving health in the U.S. and worldwide. HHI provides medical care, and hygiene and medical supplies to those in need. By the end of 2025, with the help of HHI volunteers, HHI distributed close to 350,000 hygiene kits to various disaster areas and countries such as LA wildfires, Ohio Valley flooding, Midwest tornadoes, Lebanon, etc.
